Phase One Happens When:

- 2 weeks of declining cases
- Widespread testing
- Contact tracing
- No PPE shortages

Faith Lutheran Response:

- Hold only online services
- Weddings, funerals etc will be limited to 10 people
- Small groups meet online
- Office functions are minimal with proper precautions (disinfecting, social distance, etc) Any visitors must sign in and wear a mask.
- Church Council may meet with 10 or less people with masks and proper disinfecting
- High risk individuals (people over 60 and with underlying conditions) should consider staying home

Phase Three Happens When:

• Several more weeks of improving conditions

Faith Lutheran Response:

- Continue to hold online services
- In person worship will be evaluated and capacity/guidelines determined
- Small groups may meet with continued precautions and guidelines
- High risk individuals (people over 60 and with underlying conditions) should consider staying home
- Office functions may be more regular



The Faith Lutheran Church responses will be continually evaluated and subject to change at any time. This plan is created with advice from WI Council of Churches and Rock County Health Department. See Faith Luterhan Church's guidelines for more information and specifics.

Phase Two Happens When:

- Several weeks of improving conditions
- Widespread testing
- Contact tracing
- No PPE shortages

Faith Lutheran Response:

- Continue to hold online services
- Drive-in service may occur on select Sundays
- In person Worship viewing will be evaluated with capacity/guidelines determined
- Weddings, funerals etc will be limited capacity with guidelines
- Small groups may meet at church with guidelines
- Authorized outside groups may meet with guidelines
- Office visits by appointment
- High risk individuals (people over 60 and with underlying conditions) should consider staying home

Phase Four Happens When:

A vaccine is developed or it is recommended by the CDC that gathering is again safe

Faith Lutheran Response:

- Normal operations may begin
- Attention to disinfecting will continue
- Evaluation of certain practices will need to happen
- High risk individuals (people over 60 and with underlying conditions) need to assess their safety
